Theatres closed in England (first time)

Commedia dell'Arte become **popular**

Colosseum completed in Rome

Shakespeare is born

Comedie Francais- the worlds first **national theatre** built in France

Fall of Roman Empire

Medieval drama begins to develop – **morality plays** become popular

High Middle Ages

1st recorded **European Play** performed in the Americas

Religious drama performed **outside** of churches/ in town squares/ pageant wagons

Columbus goes to America *(and sails the ocean blue)*

Christian church ex-communicates actors (for the first time)

Euripides lives *(we read his Medea)*

Origin of Greek theatre

(city Dionysus, Satyrs, Dancing, theatres in round/ built out of hills, skene, orchestra)

Louis XIV makes public declaration about the legitimacy of actors (*thanks Louis!*)

DATES (For Frani)

Some flexibility on 'general' dates is ok

550-650 BC- Origin of greek theatre

80 – Colosseum completed in Rome

197- Christians forbidden to see theatre/ church ex-communicates actors

410 – fall of Roman Empire

1200-1250 – Religious drama performed outside of church/ in town squares/ pageant wagons
